Marc McNally



At 17, Marc McNally was one of the youngest Serviceman to serve in the 1991 Gulf War With the RAF he experienced war 'at the sharp end' and still has nightmares of a Scud missile attack which killed 28 of his comrades.

After the war Marc's hearing began to deteriorate dramatically and he was discharged on medical grounds. Surgery two years later revealed that his eardrums had been completely destroyed, probably due to the vaccinations he was given prior to serving in the Gulf, Marc was now suffering from 60-80% hearing loss, dizzy spells, blinding headaches and pain in his left eye Despite numerous operations his ears refused to heal and he was forced to leave his job. With nothing but a 5% war pension to support his wife and 6 children he turned to the Legion for help .

After clearing his debts, we began fighting to secure Marc a decent war pension. Marc says: "I knew nothing about the Legion until I was advised to approach them last year. But they have turned out to be real life-savers,".
